### Saint-Véran 'Les Deux Moulins'

Charming floral aromas laced with honeysuckle and on the palate round with lovely sappiness, lifted by softer muscat-like hints.

## Chablis, Cape St Martin

Burgundy, France — No oak was harmed in the making of this Chablis, possibly why people prefer it to typical Chardonnay. Dry, elegant & mouth-watering.

## Sancerre Blanc, Berthier

Bottle £37

Loire Valley, France — Grown on beautiful rolling hills overlooking the Loire river, this is everything a Sauvignon fan could wish for: a mineral texture, high acidity, vibrant green fruits and a long finish.

Now called 'Ultra Brut' this delicate champagne is still zero dosage and is essentially champagne in its purest form. Ultra Brut can only be made in years when the grapes are at optimum ripeness with a good balance of acidity and natural sugar.

Baron de Baussac Carignan Vieilles Vignes Bottle £24

Languedoc, France — Amazingly inky and black fruit laced Carignan. Your new best friend. Once tried never forgotten.

#### Oltre Passo Primitivo, IGT

Bottle £24.50

Salento, Italy — Deep and dense in colour with a nose of warm prunes, dates and figs and hints of sweet spice. The palate is full, yet soft and plush with toasty notes that linger on the finish.

## Rioja Selection Especial Reserva

Bottle £40

Muga Rioja, Spain — A masterclass from one of the region's top estates. The best grapes are selected for the Especial blend and aged for 6 months in large vats, before 30 months in small oak barrels and a further year in bottle.

## Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Clos de L'Oratoire des Papes

Bottle £45

Rhône Valley, France — A blend of Grenache & Syrah grapes with a big smattering of the rustic charm of the southern Rhone valley. Intense, perfumed and with sweet spices, brooding black fruits and sweet red cherries. Uncork this for the table and no one will be disappointed.

# Château Batailley, Pauillac (5ème Cru Classé) 2007

Bottle £59

Named after a 'bataille' that was fought here between the French and English (who else) 600 years ago, Batailley has once again lived up to its reputation of offering good value, early drinking, quintessential Pauillac. Made from 73% Cabernet Sauvignon, 23% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Franc and 1% Petit Verdot, its toasty, ripe plum and cedar nose leads on to a palate with vivid cassis and raspberry fruit, creamy vanilla oak and a lovely long finish. Tried, trusted and adored, Batailley has produced another sterling effort in 2007.
